Q&A

Ben Tulett

Last year, aged just 19, Ben Tulett became the youngest rider to finish Liege-Bastogne-Liege in over century. Cyclist talks to a potential British GC star of the future

Cyclist: You're a multiple cyclocross World Champion and a professional rider for Alpecin-Fenix, but arguably your greatest achievement to date is holding the Q10/27 Bexley 10-mile time-trial record with a time of 21:09. Would you agree?

Ben Tulett: Ha, of course! I set that record back in 2018. It's such a good 10: straight up for five miles and down for five miles. It's so savage, especially on the way out, where you have to climb all the way up to the roundabout at the five-mile mark.

I really enjoy giving that a good crack on a Wednesday evening. It's competitive, but everyone's just enjoying themselves. It's 20 minutes of sheer pain and agony and you just know you have to go really hard at the beginning if you want a decent time.

I also set that record on junior gearing so was spinning like crazy on the long decent to the finish. I think I will need to switch to a 55T chainring if I want to go under 21 minutes.

[Ben's older brother, Daniel, took the course record even lower on 22nd May 2019 to 20:53 – the junior course record is still safely down to Ben]
